- **Sleeping troubles**
- **Feelings of helplessness**

Location: Based in the Sevenoaks area with office facilities at Sevenoaks District Council Offices and Tyland Barn, the headquarters of Kent Wildlife Trust. , Sevenoaks, Sevenoaks

The Sevenoaks Greensand Commons cover an area of nearly 300ha over 8 key project sites around 3 clusters; Seal, Sevenoaks and Westerham. They form part of a greensand ridge that stretches through Southern England.

Greensand Commons People Engagement Officer

This role is responsible for engaging a wide variety of people to discover and value the Sevenoaks Greensand Commons project sites and nurture an interest in their ongoing stewardship.

The government's decision to place all of Kent in Tier 3, and their last minute change to guidance with theatre's no longer allowed to open in Tier 3, has thrown much of the theatre industry into chaos - but - the cast of Jack and the Two Metre Beanstalk will be ploughing ahead with rehearsals, in the hope that thousands of people can then still come along and enjoy a festive treat this Christmas. There are a limited number of tickets remaining, so please keep booking and cross your fingers for a festive panto trip!

Stag CEO Andrew Eyre said: "There have been plenty of discussions behind the scenes about how we might still be able to give our loyal audiences their Stag panto. Safety remains the priority of our customers, performers and staff and we are working hard to keep everyone safe. I'm pleased to announce a live streamed performance for the opening weekend which will be very exciting. We continue to monitor the Government announcements and will keep everyone updated."

The live streamed performances, set to take place at 4.30pm and 7.30pm on Saturday 19 December, will be available for panto fans to watch not just in Sevenoaks, but all over the world, and details of how to access the broadcast will be announced soon.

Ticketholders will be contacted by the Box Office when the government announce the next phase of restrictions so please be patient - we're still hopeful for a panto run!

If the Tier 3 restrictions remain in place, all ticketholders will be offered a full refund.
